


## Pick-Up/Drop Off

Parents are asked to follow the cones set up for morning drop off/pick-up. Enter through the church driveway and exit at the parish hall driveway. Our "one lane" drive-thru is set up to flow continuously. When dropping off/picking up your child, please continue to the end of the cones before stopping. Your child will be directed to your car following dismissal.

### **Student Safety**

Adult supervision will be provided between the hours of 7:45-8:00am and 11:30-11:45am. Students should not arrive on campus any earlier, unless enrolled in Before School Care. If your child is picked up late, he/she will be signed into After School Care. If a student is registered for only one class, he/she should not be dropped off any earlier than 10 minutes prior to the start of the class and should leave promptly after the class is finished. Loitering on campus will not be permitted. St. John Vianney School will not accept responsibility for unattended children before or after their scheduled classes.

# Early Learning Center – 3&4 Year Olds 8:00 – 11:30AM (Must be 3 years old by September 30) Ms. Allison Lum

This is the perfect opportunity for our youngsters to acclimate themselves to the exciting adventure of learning! They will play games while learning, master following directions, and practice important social skills while working in a group environment. The class will help to prepare them for their pre-kindergarten year.

# Keikigarten (Must be 5 years old by September 30) Mrs. Allison Lee

Designed for the student entering kindergarten, this program will help familiarize your child with life at St. John Vianney School. Children will learn to write their name using the upper and lower case letters and will be introduced to the Spalding phonics program. Math, art and pre-reading skills will also be incorporated into the daily program.

#### Fabulous First Grade Mrs. Mary D'Avirro

8:00 - 11:30AM

Designed for students going into first grade, this three-hour class will build skills necessary for success in reading, writing, and math. In addition, the children will learn about the Spanish language and culture through stories and hands on activities.

## **Spectacular Second Grade**

8:00 - 11:30AM

Mrs. Jennifer Baum

Students entering second grade will build skills necessary for success in reading, writing, and math. The children will also learn about our Hawaiian culture through language, history, stories, and hands on activities.

## Amazing Adventures for Grades 3 & 4 8:00-11:30AM Mr. Jacob Baum

During this three-hour class, students going into third and fourth grade will build the necessary skills to help ensure success in reading and math. They will sharpen their basic math concepts in addition, subtraction, and multiplication. The remaining third of their class will be spent exploring global awareness using five geographic themes. The students will build on their knowledge of place, human/environment interaction, movement, and regions.



## **Grades 5 & 6 Masterminds**

Students entering fifth and sixth grade will focus on mastering multiplication, division, fractions, and other math skills. They will study a variety of literary works while strengthening their grammar and language skills. They will also be introduced to the art of creative writing. Students will write and revise pieces in a number of genres including personal essays, short stories, and poetry. The central focus will be on various processes for creating original works, as well as inspiring students to develop original pieces and ideas

# Grades 7 & 8 Inquisitive Intellectuals Literature, Math & Music! Ms. Sarah Young

During this three-hour class, students will explore literature through literary works, popular novels, and famous authors. They will strengthen their pre-algebra/algebra skills, including understanding the order of operations, solving fractions, and working with decimals, percent, ratios, and integers. Organization of work and the process of mathematics will be stressed. The final third of their class time will be spent exploring contemporary music through ukulele, piano, guitar, and percussion instruments.

**Refunds:** If a student withdraws before the program starts, 75% of

the fee will be refunded. There is no refund after the first

week of school.

What to Bring: Students should bring a notebook and pen/pencil on the
